Medical Assistance

- Students may go to the UCLA Ronald Reagan Medical Center for medical services.
- The Ashe Center can provide health services and referrals.
- A Sexual Assault Exam is available at the Santa Monica Rape Treatment Center (RTC). The RTC provides specialized emergency medical care, forensic services, counseling, advocacy, and information about their rights and options. The medical clinic is dedicated exclusively to sexual assault victim care 24 hours a day. It is located within the hospital, in a private, safe, therapeutic setting. The medical clinic is staffed by highly trained professionals with specialized expertise in the medical, forensic and psychological aspects of survivor care.
 - A police report is not required to receive medical assistance

Advocacy, Support Services, Housing & Academic Accommodations

- The CARE Office provides information, referrals and can connect students with a CARE advocate (***confidential source**).
- Respondent Support Services assists campus members who have been alleged to violate SVSH and Student Conduct Policy.
- The Center for Accessible Education (CAE) assists with academic and housing accommodations, and referrals.
- University Counseling & Psychological Services (CAPS) provides individual and group counseling and psychotherapy, crisis intervention and consultation (***confidential source**).
- The Office of Residential Life can assist with housing accommodations.
- Santa Monica Rape Treatment Center provides a crisis line, 24-hour advocacy, and counseling services.

Emergency Services

- The University of California Police Department (UCPD) provides 24-hour emergency services.
- Students can also call 911 for 24-hour emergency services from the Los Angeles Police Department.
